From the Desk of Pastor Kelly

I did not grow up observing Advent. At church, someone would light the candles on the Advent wreath every Sunday, of course. But to be honest, the only reason that mattered to me was because there was an *excellent* chance the kid assigned to accomplish that task would nearly ignite the wreath itself. Or (even better!) the choir director who loved long, flowing sleeves would stand too close and nearly swing her shirt into the flames.

But to actually observe a season of anxious anticipation and earnest preparation for the coming of Christ? That never crossed my mind. I was so busy preparing for the presents & parties, that I forgot to ready my mind and heart for the King. The truth is, Christmas could come and go without me actually pausing to ponder the wonder and gift of God taking on flesh to rescue sinners, redeem a fallen world and call His followers to realign our priorities to those of His Kingdom.

I think that is why Advent means so much to me as an adult. In recent years, I've begun a practice of putting the Advent candles out on my dining room table. When I sit down to dinner, I dim the kitchen lights, light the candles, read Scripture and pray. Then, I leave them lit throughout the meal. It's a concrete reminder in the darkness that in December that Light has come. And darkness can neither understand nor overcome it.

For that Light has entered into our world. Sitting there in the kitchen, receiving the Light that is Christ, I am confronted with a wonderful reminder that He did not come into the world as if it's a parallel universe. He came into this world. And He wants to come into my home, my life.

This Advent season, I encourage you to consider how you will celebrate. A simple way is to engage in the family and/or individual devotions that we have made available. If you have little ones, grab the candles and light them, then read and discuss the short age-appropriate devotional together. Invite your children into the wonder that is Christ and help them to see that Christmas actually isn't about a rotund man who specializes in breaking and entering. It's about Christ.

If your household has no little ones, pick up a copy of the WSBC 2024 Advent Devotional (or register on Church Center to have it emailed). Light the candles, sing the song, read the passage and carve out space every day to anxiously await Christ's coming.

Then join us on Christmas Eve as, together, we light candles and visually depict the Light changing us and sending us into His world.
